Kindergarten	Baby Supplies Wipes, receiving blankets, bibs, booties, socks toys, hats, lotion, powder, bath wash, baby clothes
First Grade	Toys for kids 5-10 Play-doh, lego sets, ethnic baby dolls, yo yos, , stickers, coloring books, Ethnic Barbies, My Little Pony, small action figures, small cars, non-battery toys
Second Grade	Art/ school supplies Markers, tablets, crayons, water colors, arts and craft kits, colored pencils, pens, erasers, mechanical pencils, glue sticks, sm scissors
Third Grade	Cold weather Gloves, hats, scarves, mittens, heavy socks
Fourth Grade	Small stuffed toys and Candy: (No chocolate!) sugar free, hard candy, gum, lifesavers, mints, lollipops, bubble gum, Pez candy and holders Candy should be individually wrapped.
Fifth Grade	Cold Weather Gloves, hats, scarves, mittens, heavy socks
Sixth Grade – Eighth Grade Boys	Teen boys/men Men’s cologne, deodorant, chapstick, toothbrushes, toothpaste, small pocket tools, Hackey sacks, flash lights, work boot socks, tshirts Xlarge-2X, wallets, work gloves, combs, shampoo, devotional books
Sixth Grade- Eighth Grade Girls	Teen girls/ women Hairbrush, hair gel, hair barrettes, scrunchies, head bands, bubble bath, bath wash, lotion, lip stick, lip gloss, blush, sm make-up bags, nail polish, emery boards, devotional books
